The Bible is the infallible source of doctrine and direction for our lives as we strive by the Holy Spirit to continually bring our teachings and lifestyle into ever-closer conformity with God's will.



WSRBC CHURCH CHALLENGE

July 2017

Habakkuk 3:19

"GOD, the Lord, is my strength; he makes my feet like the deer's; he makes me tread on my high places. To the choirmaster: with stringed instruments."

Heidelberg Catechism Lord's Day 16

Question 40: Why did Christ have to go all the way to death?

Answer 40: Because God's justice and truth demand it: only the death of God's Son could pay for our sin.

Question 41: Why was He "buried"?

Answer 41: His burial testifies that He really died.

Question 42: Since Christ has died for us, why do we still have to die?

Answer 42: Our death does not pay the debt of our sins. Rather, it is our entrance into eternal life.

Question 43: What further advantage do we receive from Christ's sacrifice and death on the cross?

Answer 43: Through Christ's death our old selves are crucified.

Heidelberg Catechism Lord's Day 17

Question 45: How does Christ's resurrection benefit us?

Answer 45: He has overcome death, We are already now resurrected to a new life.
