We unashamedly believe God's Word to be inerrant, infallible, and unchanging (2 Timothy 3:16). The Reformation also recovered the glorious biblical truth of salvation by grace alone. In other words, God alone saves people by sovereignly and graciously giving them faith in Jesus Christ and a trust in his sacrifice for them on the cross as a full payment for their sins (Ephesians 2:8-9).

We are a **Bible** church because we believe the Bible to be the true and complete word of salvation. The Bible is the infallible source of doctrine and direction for our lives as we strive by the Holy Spirit to continually bring our teachings and lifestyle into ever-closer conformity with God's will.

Our name **Church** means that we have a unique identity with Jesus. We are not a social club. Christ gathers us together by His Spirit and Word to worship and serve Him (John 10:14-16). We confess that Jesus Christ is the sovereign King of the Church (Colossians 1:18). 

Dear Members of WSRBC,

Thank you for your prayers and support for Grace Reformed Church, our church plant in Jersey City, New Jersey.

We thought we would alert you to a situation that has arisen there in order to request your prayers and financial support.

The church in Jersey City, Grace Reformed Church, has been in existence for four years. Reverend Sam Perez has done a great job gathering the core group (5 families) and conducting visionary and meaningful ministry in Jersey City since its inception. Growth has been slow, but we have doubled in size since we began (now 60 people) We are content to wait upon the Lord and see who He will call into the body to contribute to its growth and presence in Jersey City. But we desire to see people come to know Jesus as Savior and Lord.

A loss of a core, large family in the church has affected the financial viability of the church, and we are currently reviewing the work to see how it might best go forward.

Meanwhile giving has taken a real hit. Our budget is \$10,000 a month, but we presently are only able to raise \$5000 a month.

We're asking you to pray for this work, for the leadership at MeRF as we seek to give direction at this point the history of the church, for Reverend Sam Perez, his wife Emily, and their children, and the remaining members of the church as we earnestly desire to see this work go forward.

We are also asking you to contribute financially to this work. We have set a goal to raise \$50,000 to support the work immediately. In six months we will assess the work as to its future viability. We are approaching the churches of Classis and individuals and asking them to contribute toward this goal. Please prayerfully consider this, as the need is urgent.

WSRBC CHURCH CHALLENGE

September 2017

Haggai 2:6-7

“For thus says the Lord of hosts: Yet once more, in a little while, I will shake the heavens and the earth and the sea and the dry land. And I will shake all nations, so that the treasures of all nations shall come in, and I will fill this house with glory, says the Lord of hosts.”

Heidelberg Catechism Lord’s Day 25

Question 65: It is by faith alone that we share in Christ and all His blessings: where then does that faith come from?

Answer 65: The Holy Spirit produces it in our hearts by the preaching and confirms it through the sacraments.

Question 66: What are sacraments?

Answer 66: Sacraments are holy signs and seals for us to see. They were instituted by God so that He might make us understand more clearly the promise of the gospel, and might put His seal on that promise.

Question 67: Are both the word and the sacraments then intended to focus our faith on the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross as the only ground of our salvation?

Answer 67: Right!

Question 68: How many sacraments did Christ institute in the New Testament?

Answer 68: Two: baptism and the Lord’s Supper.

Heidelberg Catechism Lord’s Day 26

Question 69: How does baptism remind you and assure you that Christ’s one sacrifice on the cross is for you personally?

Answer 69: As surely as water washes away the dirt from the body, so certainly His blood and His Spirit wash away all my sins.

Question 70: What does it mean to be washed with Christ’s blood and Spirit?

Answer 70: That God, by grace, has forgiven my sins because of Christ’s blood; That the Holy Spirit has renewed me and set me apart to be a member of Christ.

Question 71: Where does Christ promise that we are washed with his blood and Spirit as surely as we are washed with the water of baptism?

Answer 71: In the institution of baptism where he says: “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
